"Thank you is not enough"

How you helped lopu break the "forever cycle" of debt

Iopu was working hard in his role in the public service sector. Devoted to his ageing parents and his family, he struggled to keep on top of significant monthly expenses. Iopu was stuck in a "forever" cycle of bills, debts and repayments... living from paycheck to paycheck.

He developed a simple and dangerous debt management plan:

"I found out about store cards and how easy it was to get a credit card. I was using one card to pay off another. But then it just got away on me. There was no exit plan."

A committed Christian, Iopu serves in the worship team at his church. He worried about what people would think if they knew about his situation. His embarrassment kept him from sharing his struggle or reaching out for help. But the debt was mounting... and Iopu's mental health began to suffer.

Like 8 out of 10 clients before CAP, Iopu became socially isolated. He couldn't afford to travel to family events, or give gifts as he so loved to do. He also longed to give to charities that were meaningful to him. Iopu watched his peers reach their goals... and felt the full weight of his financial situation: "Having to put aside my actual goals and visions for my life, because I was just engulfed in 'OK, how am I going to pay this?' And not ever finding a way out."

Iopu finally got tired of the cycle, and reached out to CAP. He reflects –

"I'd wasted so many years. I just got over myself and said I didn't care if my family or whoever found out that I was in this much debt. Better humble and debt free, than prideful and broke!"

Iopu still remembers his first meeting with Graham, his CAP Coach from a local church: "He was just a real positive person, just real encouraging. He said 'Hey, yeah, there's a lot [of debt], and it will take time, but you will get out of it.""

It took two years of hard work, keeping to his CAP budget and making repayments, before **Iopu received the news that he was debt free.** "When I saw the email saying that I'd cleared my debt, I rang back to close my CAP account – and then I just bawled my eyes out."

His hopes for the future had been on hold, but



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now Iopu could dream again. "Buying a house, travelling. Even just socialising!"

But the key positive outcome for Iopu? "It puts me in a better position to give."

Reflecting on his journey with CAP, Iopu said "I appreciated the phone calls, cheering me on. 'You're doing well. Keep going!' As it says in Proverbs, life and death are in the power of the

tongue, right? Those calls from CAP spoke life into my life!"

Iopu is so grateful for you:

"As a Christian, I'd always think 'yeah, God is going to help me,' forgetting that He uses people like you to help...

Then we were asked to look through our recent bank statements. What an eye-opener!

Looking back, I realise how vulnerable and unsafe we were. **Now, since doing CAP Money, we**

are in control; I know where every dollar goes. I have several accounts. Even the dog has an account!


We save for everything. \$10 a week for takeaways and when it builds up, we have fish and chips – it's part of our budget now. We needed new tyres – that was \$400 but the money was there.

I have peace of mind now. I'm so grateful to God, we know ultimately that He provides, but we need to be wise.
